Yes. Students over 16 working on journalism courses and those related including in public relations, photojournalism and others across the media industry can join the NUJ as student members.



Do I automatically become a full member when I finish studying?

NUJ student membership ceases after your course ends, but you can then get a 50% discount on NUJ temporary membership and a 25% discount on your membership fees if once you have finished your studies, you are employed full-time to do journalism.
