REASONS TO VOTE FOR ME

New collective agreements

Organising new recognition deals is my first priority. It is the most efficient and effective way to recruit members and improve conditions. Even when managements resist with every trick, we have shown at PA that organising and persistence wins in the end. Imminent changes in UK law will provide speedier routes to recognition and opportunities to get access to journalists, even those workplaces where management is most hostile. These must be exploited.

Better freelance pay

Despite comprising around a third of the NUJ's membership, freelances have suffered most grievously in recent decades. Employers have exploited changes in our industry to freeze or push down

rates. Casualisation has pushed more into precarious working, the pandemic and cost-of-living crisis have increased pressures. Addressing this must be pursued with increased vigour, challenging employers who exploit freelances, examining legal routes to challenge publishers, and organising freelances to demand better. None of this is easy, but increased momentum towards collective agreements will provide new allies amongst staff.

Defending media freedom

Campaigning for our right to report has created much of journalism's legal framework – including critical test cases like those of Goodwin and Mullin to protect sources. Driving out SLAPPs and promoting safety are equally important. I have nearly two decades of professional experience, including working with lawyers and lobbying politicians and will use this to ensure this work continues to benefit us all. The NUJ also has a proud tradition of extending international solidarity and meaningful support. This record will continue to be fostered under my watch.
