Why are we striking?

NUJ members at BBC Local working in radio, TV and online are opposing proposed **cuts to local radio.** BBC plans will mean output after 2pm weekdays and at weekends will now be shared and cuts will mean just 40 hours a week of guaranteed local programming. BBC Local Radio provides a **vital service of news, information, and companionship** for its communities and members are striking to protect it.

Striking is the last resort

The NUJ has held negotiations with the BBC, attempting to solve the dispute and reduce cuts to local radio. Despite our best efforts, no acceptable proposal has been put forward by the broadcaster.

The NUJ balloted 1000 members as part of the dispute and 83% voted in favour of strike action.

Journalists are taking a stand to save local radio.
